


Indigenous Instruments

Materials used

- 1. Early instruments were made from 'found objects' like shells and plant parts.
- 2. Almost every material in nature has been used to make musical instruments.
- 3. Raw materials are bamboo, gourd, wood, leaves, etc.





Indigenous Instruments

- 1. Naga instruments are quite elementary (basic).
- 2. But they produce beautiful 'tribal/earthly' sound.
- 3. Instruments were invented and developed further.
- 4. Each instrument produce different sounds from each other.



Indigenous Instruments

- 1. Cup Violin/Single String Violin/ Tati
- 2. Bamboo Mouth Organ
- 3. Bamboo Flute
- 4. Trumpet
- 5. Drum
- 6. Log Drum
- 7. Bamboo Sounding Box
- 8. Leaf Music



Cup Violin/Single String Violin/Tati

- Single String Naga Traditional Instrument.
- Invented and used since a long time ago.
- Oral tradition says that man learnt to use this instrument from a crab.
- Also called Mid Night violin because it was played at night.



How is the Cup Violin made?

- Use a good quality bamboo that is hard and thin. Sometimes a shell or gourd is used.
- Finely cut a bamboo of 15 cm length into the shape of a mug.
- A small hole made 5 cm below the rim of the cup on both sides of the cup opposite each other.





How is the Cup Violin made?

- Take a piece of bamboo stick about 2 feet long and insert it through the holes of the cup
- Take another thin bamboo for the bow and tie a string on both ends.

Bamboo Mouth Organ

- One of the oldest Naga traditional instrument.
- Made with bamboo. Any kind of thin bamboo.
- Has a captivating sound.
- Mainly played in dormitories Zuki, where young girls sleep.
- Anyone can play it.
- Produces 4 different sounds.

Bamboo Mouth Organ

- Take a 6 inch bamboo inch about ½ inch wide.
- Made a nail head on one side.
- Tie a string.



Bamboo Flute

- Simplest instrument.
- Produces haunting beautiful sounds.
- Ani variety of bamboo used.
- Bamboo is cut, hollowed (emptied inside), dried and holes are cut to make pitches.
- Sound quality depends upon maker and type of bamboo used.



Trumpet

- Common instrument a long time ago.
- Different sizes and shapes.
- Cut bamboo that has 2 nodes
- Keep lower end open
- Hole in center and upper node.
- A short hole is open and a small bamboo is inserted.
- Small bamboo is the mouthpiece



Drum

- Drums were used for many purposes.
- Mostly used during festivals while dancing and singing.
- Zeliangs are fond of using drums.
- Different shapes and sizes.





Log Drum

- Made of huge log
- Best wood to make it is Phoebe Goalparensis (Bonsum).
- Tree is tall and big and easy to be curved into shape.
- Hit with stone or wood to make a log sound.
- Used during festivals, emergencies, dangers, wars, etc.

Bamboo sounding box

- Made of bamboo.
- Chase birds and keep one alert from fear and loneliness and chasing wild animals.
- Remove block section inside the bamboo.
- Put small woods inside it.
- Shake to produce sound.




Leaf Music

- Used only by experts as it is not easy
- Special kind of leaves.
- Leaf is folded once and blown.
- Some experts don't even fold it.
- Produces sweet sounds.
- Can be used for all types of songs.
